Discipleship Sunday will be Sunday, August 27th.


This is the day that we will celebrate all our 3rd graders with their 3rd grade Bibles during both worship services.



Here are some suggestions:

- + Pray for those who are seeking a church home. Groups & individuals can pray for the ongoing ministry and for new guests by name each week.
- + Help fill up the Welcome Gift Bags once a quarter or as needed.
- + Look for new guests on their row or sitting near them & linger a few minutes after service to help them receive their "first time gift" & help them connect to someone else &/or one of the Pastors.
- + Individuals gifted &/or led to this type of ministry could serve as a team member on a rotating basis once every month or two after the worship service (either 8:45 or 11:00).
- Before each service, team members could also be available to help new folks enter the building & find their way to the sanctuary, restrooms, nursery, etc as needed.
- + When contact information is received from guests, team members might also write them a note or email to assist the Pastors with further contact & follow-up.
- + Look for opportunities by asking God to raise your radar so that you might sense when guests who come here for the first time might be offered these kinds of affirmations that make TRUMC such a special place!
