In our overly complex world, it is important to come back to the basics, to the heart of our faith to discover again what it looks like to live out our beliefs. When Methodism was in its infancy, John Wesley, the co-founder of the Methodist movement, knew the movement was growing so fast that he could not meet with each group of people. Most did not have a lot of knowledge of the details of the Christian faith.-they were very young in the faith

Wesley also realized that the lives of people of faith can be pretty messy. He believed that living a holy and good life required help from a caring community, commitment to the practice of spiritual discipline, and ongoing instruction. He needed something to help people who knew very little, as well as those who knew quite a bit about the faith, to talk about their spiritual growth together.

In 1742, John came up with "General Rules." Three rules that were so simple and challenging.

They were also easy to remember !!!

<u>3 Simple Rules:</u>
 1. Do no harm,
 2. Do good,
 3. Stay in love with God.

In 2007, Bishop Ruben Job, a retired bishop from the Iowa Episcopal area, wrote a book called *Three Simple Rules* that remind us not only of our Methodist heritage, but also that these three rules are meant not only for Methodists, but for all followers of Jesus.

During September, we are going to be looking at these rules one by one to see how we can implement them in our own lives, and more importantly how these rules can change our lives.
